Dear Families,
Welcome to 2024 at Dawn House School!

We have an **exciting year ahead** with the main feature being that the year is the schools official **50**th **birthday**. Over the next weeks we will be pulling together a plan for the year which will include a competition to devise a logo, thoughts about birthday merchandise and a whole host of fun events that may also generate some income for the school.

Staff started the year with 2 days of planning and learning time. We ran First Aid and Lifeguarding training, did some learning about PDA (Pathological Demand Avoidance), information sharing about a whole school resource we are producing and some external safeguarding updates. It was a busy return to school and in our reflections of the amount of statutory training we need to complete and the ongoing learning we need to provide for staff to ensure expertise and skill, we have decided to add an **extra INSET day** to this school year. This will be on **July 1st**, so school will be closed to children.

Talking of dates, our term dates are now on the website and as usual, follow the Nottinghamshire County Council school holidays. Our INSET days are detailed on there. I also draw you attention to a date for your diaries- **Saturday 30th November will be our Parents' Day** (a whole day this time as time was a little short when we tried to condense the last one). This will also host our Christmas Fair, so we will be happy for you to bring additional family members and will provide space for them to wait and have refreshments.

Following this day, on Monday  $2^{nd}$  Dec, school will be closed to pupils and to child facing staff.

It seems early to be thinking of next Christmas I know, but hopefully it helps with your forward planning.

This is also a good time to thank you all for your support of our Christmas Fair and show 2023. It was amazing to see so many new faces and to have so many of you supporting the day. We made a record breaking (almost) £1,400 from the stalls, the raffle and all the other activities on the day. The Friends of Dawn House are the parent/staff group who get together to share ideas and run all of these events, so a big thank you to them and a call out to any of you out there who would like to join us. It's a great way of meeting other parents and getting involved in the life of the school. We plan to arrange monthly meetings



which we will set the dates for this week and let you know. We love to have people join us, even if you can't make every meeting or have limited availability. I'll share dates for these meetings in next week's newsletter.
