Here at Dawn House, we are very sensitive and flexible to the individual needs of children so I would encourage you to reach out to your form teacher or our Wellbeing Team in school if you need any help or assistant to ensure your child can attend as much as possible. We would like to improve our school's overall attendance rate and reduce the number of pupils who miss more than 10% of their learning time and by working together we may see some successes in attendance also.

The Government's definition of persistent absenteeism is anyone with an attendance rate of less than 90%. Attendance has had many media reports nationally during the year and is something that we are required to report on. Our undeniable goal is however, for every individual pupil attending Dawn House School to achieve their very own individual best in all areas of their development and learning.
