Adjustments Needed: Is there anything that's been difficult or confusing? What could we do to improve this in the future?

- 6th Form: Like to be able to play football with the younger ones, the mini bus isn't in great condition, improving the communication from school as sometimes 6th form can miss things
- Chimes: House system no mixing or changing teams, PLG website spelling mistakes
- KS3 DE: Forest Schools is cold, it would be good to have lunch with other key stages not just our own
- KS3 AD: More trips and residentials
- KS3 JC: Some core subjects
- Primary 1: Not hitting, pushing and making sure we share
- Primary 2: Slow down the lessons a bit
- Junior: Some lessons, choosing where we sit
- KS4 LC: Staff forgetting to put merits on which is unfair, sometimes lessons can go on too long as this makes us late for our next lessons
- KS4 MW: PSHE environment is challenging because of the content. Too many distractions in some lessons.
- KS4 SW: More break times, more Maths, another timetable display in school

General comments:

- Groups could line up better and it makes it hard to move around our equipment from class to class
- Strangers around school can make me feel uncomfortable
- Reminder about red lanyard for visitors

Have you ever been taught how to keep yourself safe at school and at home (e.g., online safety, bullying)? What did you learn?

- Primary 2: If you're not kind to other people they won't be kind to you. Know about bullying and what ir is.
- Primary 1: Being able to share and make friends
- KS4 LC: Online safety taught in Computing
- 6th Form: Don't talk to strangers, don't bully, going out in the community helps us know we need to stay with the adults and don't talk to strangers
- KS3 DE: Learning about being safe online, first aid in life skills, Bikeability
- KS3 AD: Don't share personal information, learnt about self-harm in PSHE
- Junior: Blocking people online who make you feel unsafe
- JS3 JC: Making sure parents can see what you do online
